The regular monthly meeting of Partners Against Crime, District 3 was called to order at 10:05 a.m. at the Community & Family Life Recreation Center at Lyon Park, Co-facilitator Alice Breeden being in the chair and Co-Secretaries Carol Baldwin and Marcella Jones being present.

Action on Agenda/Minutes from last meeting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The minutes from last meeting and the agenda were approved as presented.
Programs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Shari Metcalf, and Caley Patten, from the Office of Budget Management Services, Office of Performance Innovation</i>, presented a summary of the draft of the City's Three-year Strategic Plan https://durhamnc.gov/183/Strategic-Plan that City Council will vote by end of the month.
Treasurer's Report (Reported by Mary Davis)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Last month of 2017-18 annual budget cycle. New 2018-19 budget period starts July 1.
National Night Out (reported by Alice Breeden)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NNO is Tuesday, August 7. In order to receive resources from the City and be eligible for PAC3's NNO give aways at the July 14 meeting, neighborhoods must register with the City by July 9 and have a representative present at the July 14 meeting.
Department and Organizations Reports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Captain Brian Reitz, Commander District 3</i>, thanked community for making him feel welcome. Year-to-date overall crime is down about 30% citywide, 24% District 3, property crime in District 3 down 21%. PAC3 issue trending is unlocked car break-ins, predominately in southern part of the city. <i>Kim Lane, Captain over Community and Animal Services, Durham County Sheriff's Office</i>, advised that traffic will be heavy around Duke University next Mon/Tues due to high school graduations at Cameron indoor stadium and the Project Graduation event Tuesday. Reminded pet owners to be mindful of the upcoming heat wave and the Durham law that dogs cannot be left unattended when tethered. <i>Lawanda Mock, Community Resource Officer, DPD</i>—gave tips on car safety; reported an increase in interest for NW groups. <i>Laura Biediger, Community Engagement Coordinator, Neighborhood Improvement Services</i> – Congratulations to Marcella Jones who was recognized as the May 2018 Monthly Neighbor Spotlight. Two citizen engagement program deadlines: Citizens Police Academy, August 10 and Neighborhood College August 3. Recognized Mr. Pratt, Code Enforcer Officer from District 3. <i>Dee Spellman, Dept. of Parks & Recreation</i>, reported outdoor pools locations/hours and summer camp days/hours. Crestfield Baseball Park not open until at least mid-August. <i>Cindie Cavender, Durham Court Watch</i> – currently following 104 repeat-offender defendants recommended to Court Watch by law enforcement and the DA's office. Volunteered 108 hours during first quarter. x <i>Alice Breeden, (for Mindy Solie/TRY-Together for Resilience Youth)</i>, next meeting is June 13. <i>Alice Breeden (for Mindy Solie/ATT Watch)</i> – Trail Watchers volunteered 190 hours in May.
Unfinished Business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Dee Spellman</i> gave an update on action taken in regards to the continuing lighting issue and other concerns at Lyon Park. Assistant directors Jason Jones (Programming) and Thomas Dawson (Infrastructure) are working together to try to assess the park for crime-prevention improvements through the environmental design perspective, but she has not been advised of a date set for further action. Will update next month. <i>Alice Breeden</i> reported that PAC3 is still looking for a co-facilitator to serve the 2018-2020 term. No facilitator is in place. Discussion on the future of PAC3 will be on next Month's agenda.
Announcements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Susan Martin, Dementia Inclusive Durham</i>, announced the group will hold a 3-month series of forums, beginning July 28th here at Lyon Park Center. Next meeting is Saturday, July 14.
