Election of Officers will be held during the scheduled PAC3 meeting on April 11,2015.

Positions for elected officers are open to all PAC3 voting members, with the exception of members who are actively employed by the City of Durham or are officers in the City of Durham Police Department.

Each nominee for any of the elected offices must submit to a Co-Facilitator before the scheduled April 11th PAC3 meeting, a written request for their name to be placed on the ballot for the election at the April PAC3 meeting.

Co-Facilitator Duties: There are two co-facilitators for PAC3 with staggered terms. Co-facilitators are the official spokespersons for PAC3. Working together they guide the Executive Committee (all elected officers and immediate past co-facilitator) in presenting to the membership yearly goals which help set the speakers for the year, proposed expenditures and various PAC3 activities. The co-facilitator(s) conduct the monthly meeting, post meeting notices on list serv , prepare the agenda and secure speakers for the meetings. They share the responsibilities (or assign to other PAC3 members) of attending the monthly Citywide PAC and Citizen's Crime Commission meetings. Convenes and presides over Executive Board meetings (approximately 3 a year).

Secretary Duties: There are two secretaries each with their own distinct responsibilities.

Secretary #1 (Term: 2015-2017) is responsible for the maintenance of the PAC3 website and list serv. Maintains the corporate records manual. Attends Executive Board meetings.

Secretary #2 (Term: 2015-2016) takes minutes for monthly PAC3 meetings and any Executive Board meetings. Collects attendance sheets and records, by neighborhoods, their attendance. Attends monthly PAC3 and Executive Board meetings.

Treasurer Duties: The treasurer submits requisitions for expenditures requested by the PAC3 membership. PAC3 has no checking/savings account and all monies are processed by NIS. Attends monthly PAC3 and Executive Board meetings.

Member-at-Large: As a member of the Executive Board, helps set yearly goals and expenditures. Attends monthly PAC3 and Executive Board meetings.

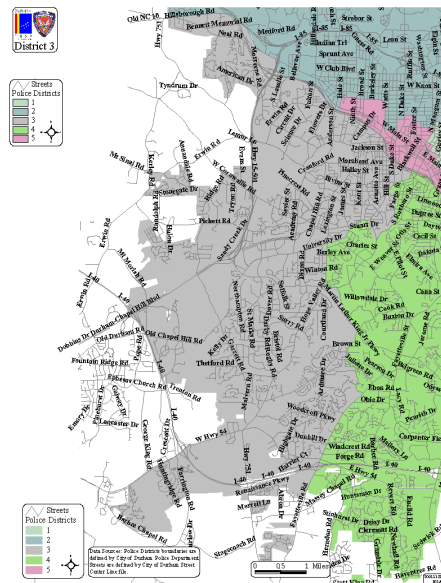
